Highway 101 Bookstores

During October and November 2016, your editor and his wife had a driving holiday along the coast of Oregon and California and revisited several wonderful bookstores along US Highway 101. Highlights are:

Robert's Bookshop in Lincoln City (3412 S.E. Hwy 101) – This rambling warren of rooms is a book-lovers dream – complete with a cat or two, snoozing among the stacks. You turn a corner and another room opens up – all well-organized, even the overflow stacks along the floor. Over 150,000 volumes.

Gold Beach Books (29707 Ellensburg Ave) – started by a Portland book collector, this fine large collection of new and used books (over 75,000 volumes) fills two floors of a new building, complete with coffee shop just south of the center of Gold Beach. Spend some time in his rare book collection on the 2nd Floor!

Eureka bookstores (2) – At the corner of E & 2^{nd} Street in the Eureka old town are two wonderful used bookstores: Booklegger on the corner (402 2^{nd} Street) and Eureka Books (426 2^{nd} Street) in the middle of the block. When you are hungry there is a bakery with coffee around the corner, and the Eureka waterfront cafes three blocks away.

In addition, we stopped at wonderful Public Libraries – where their Friends' groups always sold used books to raise money. The best were:

<u>Saratoga Friends' Book Store</u> (a wonderful store – separate from the library -- in the center of old town Saratoga)

San Clemente Friends' Bookstore (next door to the Library)

Rancho Mirage Library BookNook (in the library, next to a bakery) [OK, OK ... not exactly on US 101]

Cannon Beach Library Book Store (in the library)
